

## Contributor Policies

Practical Distributism was established to explain and promote the economic and political ideas of Distributism (a.k.a., Distributivism). By submitting articles to Practical Distributism, you are contributing to this effort and agree to the following.

### Submitting Original Articles

When you submit an original article for publication, it remains your property. Your submission grants Practical Distributism the right to publish your work under the *Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International License*. (<https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0/>) It is your responsibility to understand the terms of this license. You can revoke this right for any article by retracting your submission *prior to its publication on the site*. Notices of retraction need to be submitted by e-mail to PracticalDistributism@gmail.com.

### Submitting Previously Published Articles

By submitting an article that has been previously published, you are asserting that (1) the article is your own work and (2) you have the right to submit it for publication. You are responsible to inform the editor of any required attribution. You are responsible to notify the editor of any modifications from the original publication so they can be noted. Previously published articles remain under the license and copyright restrictions of their original publication. In all other respects, submitting a previously published article is the same as submitting an original article.

### Editorial Policy

It is the intention of the editor that your articles should truly be your own work. Although the editor reserves the right to reject any submission or to require an alteration in the text, for the most part suggested alterations will not be mandatory. Edits will not be made to your work without your approval.

### Publication Policy

The decision to publish or not publish an article belongs to the editor. If you are granted access to edit your articles directly on the site (this requires a Google account), you agree that you will not publish any articles without authorization from the editor.

You agree that, once an article is published, you will not make any changes to it. If it is found that an edit needs to be made after publication, you will notify the editor who has the sole authority to make the needed modification.
